## Managing Member Behaviour & Disciplinary Procedures in Clubs

Club XYZ encountered behavioural issues among its members, leading the Secretary to suspend two individuals. However, the board subsequently reversed this decision, causing embarrassment for the Secretary and undermining his perceived authority. The Club Secretary defended their actions by citing their authority in a prior position.

## **Key Issues**

Lack of adherence to the Club's constitution
 The Secretary suspended the members without following the established procedures outlined in the Club's constitution.

- Absence of due process
   The suspended members were not provided with notices of charge nor given an opportunity to respond to the allegations against them.
- Unauthorised suspension
   The Club's constitution mandates a disciplinary meeting before a member can be suspended, a requirement that was overlooked in this instance.

#### Resolution

Upon discovering the procedural irregularities, the board intervened and overturned the suspensions. The decision was based on the grounds of noncompliance with the Club's constitution. While the board's action rectified the procedural error, this action let to conflicts within the Club and raised questions regarding the Secretary's authority and decision-making process.

#### **Lessons Learned**

- Adherence to the constitution
   Not all constitutions are built the same —
   boards and secretaries should ensure
   understanding BEFORE an issue arises. Clubs
   seeking to change their constitution should
   seek legal advice.
- Due process
   Providing members with notices of charge and opportunities to respond is essential for fairness and transparency in disciplinary proceedings.
- 3. Upholding authority and accountability
  While the Secretary holds authority, decisions
  must be made in alignment with the Club's
  guidelines and with consideration for potential
  board intervention.

### Conclusion

The case of Club XYZ underscores the importance of effective governance and communication in managing disciplinary issues within clubs. By learning from this experience and implementing measures to improve transparency and adherence to protocol, clubs can mitigate conflicts and maintain integrity in their decision-making processes.
